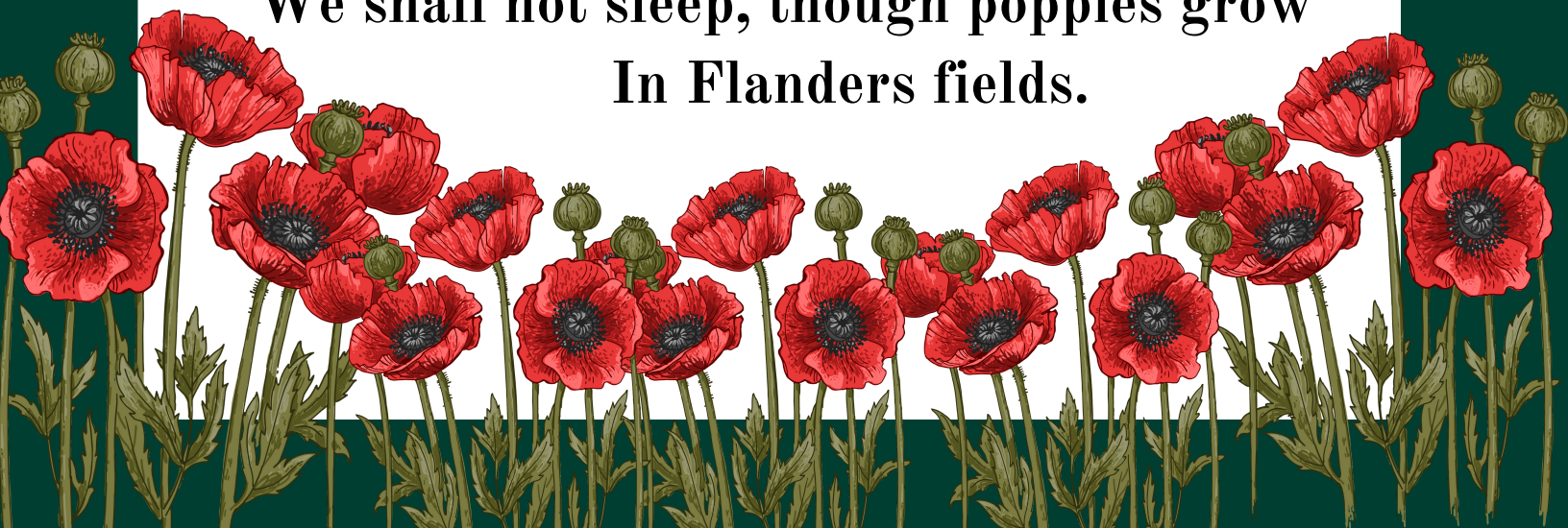

In Flanders fields.





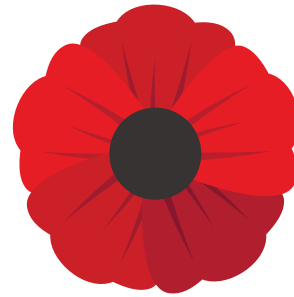

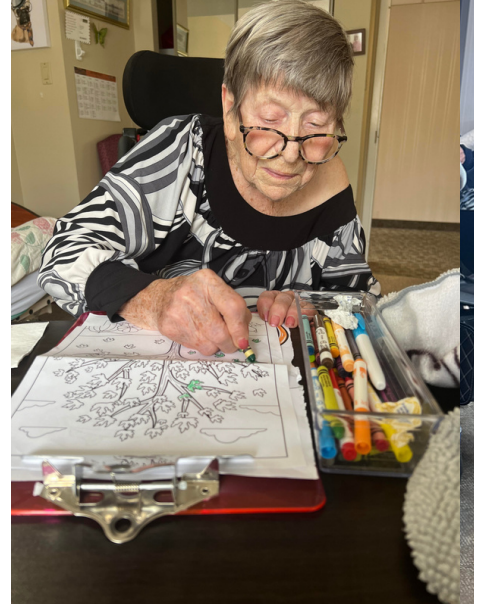
