Stay at home when you are sick





Please join us in applauding Lorna Floren of Sunnidale as November's Participant of the Month!"


Village Highlights

In September we brought back Conversation Café's.

We received quire a few responses and the top three aspirations we felt that we would like to see more in in the village in the year ahead were:

- Create Opportunities for Shared & Meaningful Activities
- Promote Resident Empowerment
- Offer Flexible Living

Promote Resident Empowerment:

Our Villages support our residents' right to choose, and encourage residents to contribute to Village Life and their community which fosters purpose, meaning and growth. "Residents are our leaders."

Let's explore how this can be lived out in village life:

- Involving residents in all decision making (clothing, bedtime/awake time, meals, drinks and snacks, care plans, medication changes, shower/tub days & time, participation in village life, care conferences, etc.)
- Involving residents in committees (VAT, Quality of Life, Resident Council, etc.).
- Having residents participate in all aspects of village lift and empowering them with the knowledge of how to safely do things that might be considered "high risk" activities.
- We promote knowing our residents likes and dislikes and preferences, but we have to always remember the importance of not assuming and asking the resident if they want tea or coffee, what kind of juice or snack they would like, as well as choice of meal. We can all be creatures of habit and will typically make the same choice day after day, but there will always be that time that we might change up our order and want to try something new.
- Involving residents in creating, and maintaining their care plan and making sure that if residents have goals (learning something new, weight loss or strength goals, etc.) that we are involving them in all areas of achieving this goal.


